THE VISUAL EFFECTS OF

CONSPIRACY

he crew of the starship Enterprise must overcome Starfleet Command officers who are infected by an alien parasite. This is the plot of "Conspiracy," the 24th episode of the first season of *Star Trek: The Next Generation*. This episode has the dubious honor of having one or more shots censored as "violent images" by the BBC in England. It is reported that the episode required a warning before airing in Canada.

The story required that the parasite climb the leg of an officer then later climb out of the mouth of another fallen human host and attempt to escape.

Visual Effects Supervisor Dan Curry approached my visual effects company in April of 1988 with the project. Animating the parasite bugs for the episode was my first work on **Star Trek**:

The Next Generation.

The property master, Alan Sims, had commissioned another company to create the bug. They had done a fine sculpting job but I realized we would have to re-build it for the

stop motion animation required for the shots.

The creature was cast in a dense silicone material and was very stiff. The legs were small nubs that were not long enough to reach the floor to propel the creature along. We set about re-

sculpting the creature and giving it longer legs and defining the body segments a bit more.

A plaster mold was made and fitted with a simple wire armature and the creature was cast in rubber.

We scheduled the animation time, then were told by Dan Curry that the date we were to animate was actually the date they needed the work finished. We scrambled to get the animation set up. Dan had provided frames of the woman opening her mouth so we could line up the parasite's animation with the actor's performance. I asked Dan if we could have a bloody slime trail from the woman's mouth

but he didn't think the producers would like it. I thought it would help sell the horror of the situation but, disappointed, we moved on.

Dan has also provided a 4ft x 8ft piece of hard Formica flooring to match the set. It was so big I had to place it on a sheet of Celotex board on my studio concrete floor and animate on my hands and knees. The surface was tough so I could not directly pin the model to the floor for the animation legs. After a couple of scenes were done, the armature wires broke and the body segment with the last two legs fell off the puppet! I finished the shot by animating the now two body sections along and making them appear as one creature.

As I worked, on another stage my assistant, Stephen Lebed, animated the parasite climbing the leg of the main host, Lt. Commander Remmick. Stephen faced his own challenges as the creature







process. I had to drill through the hard Formica then drive a pin through the parasite's foot into the Celotex insulation board below. This prevented the feet from sliding around as I animated the body.

I animated the creature along by twisting the parasite's body segments in sequence with the was difficult to attach and animate effectively on the pants cloth.

It was a challenge but it was fun, and the creature scenes from "Conspiracy" continue to get comments. This episode is often included on lists of The Next Generation's greatest moments.

The Next Step in Mars Exploration

onday November 26th, 2018 saw the beginning of the next steps in the exploration of the planet MARS with the successful landing of NASA's InSight spacecraft. InSight stands for "INterior exploration using Seismic

Investigations, Geodesy, and Heat Transport". This \$814

million stationary lander's purpose is to study Mars

interior, to determine whether it has a liquid or solid core via seismic waves produced by marsquakes, to determine the heat flow out of the interior, and a radio experiment to determine perturbations in Mars rotation axis, that might indicate the presence of a core.

The spacecraft contains a French seismometer and a German heat flow probe, the latter of which will drill down 5 meters (16 feet) into the crust for better measurements. Both the seismometer and heat flow probe will be placed on the surface by a robotic arm equipped with a camera. The landing site, in Mars Elysium Planitia, is "as flat

as a parking lot", and was chosen to avoid a rocky surface so that the instruments can obtain the best measurements.

This solar-powered lander will operate for one

Mars year (two Earth years) plus 40 Mars days (or "sols"),



until November 24, 2020. Most likely it will be able to

function in an "extended mission" for some time afterwards to gather more data.

InSight was accompanied to Mars by the first planetary CubeSats, MarCO-A and B. Mars Cube One (A and B) are the size of shoeboxes, and were used to transmit telemetry information from InSight while it was landing. They successfully demonstrated that CubeSats can be used to support planetary exploration and bode well for future planetary CubeSats, such as Arizona State University's Luna-H Map, which will be launched with the first Space Launch System (SLS) test flight in 2019.

This fall Trek fans have been given a brand new treat. For the first time, during the hiatus of a first-run Star Trek TV series, CBS is providing a series of four, 15-minute short stories to 'tide us over' until the next season begins. I am referring to Short Treks, taking place in the prime universe in and around the adventures of the current series. Star Trek

Discovery, all airing on CBD All Access, CBS's streaming channel. So far, two of the four Short Treks have aired, although the third, "The Brightest Star", will be released soon, on Thursday, December 6. Here are some thoughts on the first two episodes:

Calypso, released November 1, 2018: We meet a new human character,



Runaway, released 2018: This story takes place between the Season 1 finale and the Season 2 premiere, and finds Ensign Sylvia Tilly (Mary Wiseman) talking hologram with her overbearing mother (Mimi Kuzyk) about the Command Training Program. Tilly soon encounters a young, wounded stowaway, Po (Yadira Guevara-Prip), a teenage girl from Xahea. Tilly heals her injury and they strike up a friendship, as Po helps her deal with her feelings about her mother, and Tilly helps Po prepare for her new role (next stage of evolution) as Queen of Xahea (and protector of the

Craft (Aldis Hodge), rescued from an escape pod and distant conflict by the self-aware USS Discovery, 1000 years in the future!! The 33rd century!! We don't know where the Discovery's crew went, but the ship has been waiting for them for a thousand years (Crossfieldclass ships are tough!) Maybe this is why we never heard of the Discovery in the future. This story, written by Pulitzer Prize-winning writer Michael Chabon, is full of mythological themes and become a love story between Craft and the Discovery Al (Zora) as he misses his family, wants to return home, and Zora (Annabelle Wallis) is conflicted with enjoying his company and wanting to send him home. This episode is unlike an Trek produced before, well worth viewing, and perhaps indicates some of the storytelling themes we can expect from Chabon, as he is a writer/producer on the upcoming 'Picard Show'.

to be released on December 6,

2018: This is intended to fill in some of backstory of Commander Saru (Doug Jones), first officer of the USS Discovery. Expect to gain insight into the nature of the Kelpians, his prey species and their home planet, and how he got into Starfleet.

We will review the remaining two Short Treks in the next issue! Remember: Star Trek Discovery Season 2 will premiere on Thursday, January 17th, 2019. The UFP will co-host a Watch Party in the Marston Exploration Theater in the School of Earth and Space Exploration at ASU in Tempe that evening. Stay tuned!



I'M RESURRECTING my column SF Tube

Talk for **Subspace Chatter**. I'll try to feature news about upcoming science fiction and fantasy TV shows of interest to UFP members. *SF Tube Talk* was a regular feature in the **Connotations** newszine published by **CASFS** for over 20 years.

The TV landscape has vastly changed since I last wrote this column. With various streaming services, broadcast and cable, the amount of genre programming has greatly expanded. It is also pretty easy to catch up with current series via online streaming as well. So, I'll be reporting on a variety of genre stuff, some immediately upcoming or recently available to stream.



DOCTOR WHO Fans won't have to wait long for another episode of *Doctor Who*, with the season finale airing December 9th. However, this year, the wait will be a bit longer since for the first time since the show returned in 2005, there won't be a new *Doctor Who* episode on Christmas Day. Instead, they will have a new episode on New Year's Day. As is the usual

pattern for the BBC, there's not much known about the episode, no tile and not even any guest stars have been announced.

The BBC describes the episode with "As the New Year begins, a terrifying evil is stirring from across the centuries of Earth's history. Will the Doctor, Ryan (Tosin Cole), Graham (Bradley Walsh) and Yaz (Mandip Gill) be able to overcome this threat to Planet Earth?"



Needless to say, BBC America will still be running lots of *Doctor Who* on Christmas Day as well as the week leading up to the New Year's Day special.

Going back in time a bit for the season finale on December 9th, there will be an all day marathon of all Season 11 episodes leading up to the season finale *The Battle of Ranskoor Av Kolos* "On the planet of Ranskoor Av Kolos, lies the remains of a brutal battlefield. But as the Doctor, Graham, Yaz and Ryan answer nine separate distress calls, they discover the planet holds far more secrets. Who is the mysterious commander with no memory?"

SUPERHEROES For superhero action, the annual crossover episodes for The CW's "Arrowverse" is featuring a three night reality bending "Elseworlds" event spanning episodes of *The Flash, Arrow* and *Supergirl* starting Sunday December 9th through Tuesday December 11th. In addition to Barry "Flash" Allen and Oliver "Arrow" Queen switching places for some unknown reason, we will be introduced to Batwoman (a relatively recent addition to the *Batman* mythos) in a Gotham City with a missing Batman, a Monitor (first seen in the

comics as part of Crisis on Infinite Earths) who monitors the multiverse, the first appearance of Lois Lane (we've seen her sister Lucy, but she's only been an off-screen character so far), a return appearance of Superman (as well as a possible black clad doppelganger from another reality), and John Wesley Shipp appearing as The Flash he played on the 1990's TV series (although he has played the Jay Garrick Flash as well as Barry Allen's father). There will likely be other surprises as well. Note that the other DC based shows. DCs **Legends of Tomorrow** and **Black Lightning** are not participating in this crossover. But be sure to check them out, especially Legends, which is the most fun you can have with a superhero series. The crossover will serve as the mid-season finale for the 3 shows, all of which will return in mid-January.

New on The CW on Tuesdays starting Jan 15 will be *Roswell, New Mexico*. It is effectively a reboot of the original *Roswell* TV series but the aliens have kept their origins secret into their mid-20s, so it will be a more adult take on the aliens and their friends taking on a government conspiracy.



NIGHTFLYERS For Sci Fi with a heavy dose of horror, check out *Nightflyers* currently running over a two week stretch on the SYFY. It is based on a George R. R. Martin novela, and Syfy is making it available via all of its outlets: website, streaming, app, and broadcast. The show "follows a team of scientists aboard The Nightflyer, the most advanced ship ever built, as they embark on a journey to find other life forms. Their mission takes them to the edge of the solar system, and to the edge of insanity, as they

realize true horror isn't waiting for them in outer space - it's already on their ship."



THE ORVILLE After over a year The Orville returns for it's second season on FOX with a special Sunday night debut followed by weekly airings on Thursday night. According to FOX, "In Season Two, Ed and Kelly's relationship will take a new turn, while the ship's crew will meet never-before-seen aliens, face old adversaries the Krill, make first contact with a new civilization and revisit the planet Moclus." Look for a slightly more serious take on the show and more emphasis on the science fiction plots in the new season.

GOTHAM Also on FOX will be the fifth and final season of *Gotham*, which is subtitled "Legend of the Dark Knight." It starts on January 3rd and will wrap up the series with twelve episodes with more development of Bruce Wayne as well as introducing to the series villains such as Bane.

THE PASSAGE In mid-January, FOX debuts The Passage,

a series based on the novel of the same name by Justin Cronin. "It focuses on Project Noah, a secret medical facility where scientists are experimenting with a dangerous virus that could lead to the cure for all disease, but also carries the potential to wipe out the human race. When a young girl is chosen to be a test subject, a federal agent is tasked with bringing her in, but ultimately, becomes her surrogate father, determined to protect her at any cost - even as Project Noah's work threatens to unleash an unimaginable apocalypse."

UPDATE: CETI ALPHA V

Acclaimed **Star Trek** director Nicholas Meyer recently said "I was commissioned to write a 3-night event called **Ceti Alpha V** and I don't know the current status. It's been up in the air. Partially, there was a lot of confusion between CBS, and there were big upheavals at CBS and while they sort of didn't know who was in charge, they also didn't know what they were going to do with *Ceti Alpha V.* I'm not exactly sure what's happened, I haven't heard from them in some time."



RUMOR: SECTION 31 SERIES

Deadline is reporting that CBS is in talks with actress Michelle Yeoh to lead a new Star Trek TV series. First appearing in **Star Trek: Discovery**'s 2-part pilot where her character of Captain Georgiou was killed off, Yeoh still returned a number of times during the first season, most notably playing Geogiou's Mirror Universe counterpart.

The CBS plan would be for Yeoh to play her Emperor Georgiou character,

in her capacity as an operative for Section 31. Yeoh is already set to appear in the second season of Discovery and was featured in the NYCC trailer in her Section 31 outfit. According to the report, the Yeoh Star Trek show is in the early planning stages, but "looks likely to focus on a



continuation of her **Discovery** Season 2 adventures in Starfleet's Section 31 division."
